

Background

- Bike Cochrane commissioned a survey of parents of students in Cochrane in May-June 2021 to help with 2021 'Bike To School' campaign
- Survey went out directly to principals of all schools in Cochrane, along with to our social media, and newspapers too

One Motivation for Kids Biking to School


• One 2012 Danish survey looked at nearly **20,000 Danish kids** between the ages of 5 and 19. It found that **kids who cycled or walked to** school, rather than traveling by car or public transportation, performed measurably better on tasks demanding concentration, such as solving puzzles, and that the effects lasted for up to four hours after they got to school (more than ensuring that they ate breakfast)




















Do you have access to a bicycle that you could ride to school on? 269 responses











Do you know of a safe route to bike to school from your home? 267 responses




91% of survey respondents WOULD bike to school if there were a safe route! Would you bike to school if there was a safe route? 257 responses

How long do you think it would take you to bike to school? ²⁶⁸ responses






If you biked to school (or presently bike to school), would you do it alone, or with a parent/older sibling/friend? 264 responses




Do you feel there is adequate and safe bike parking at your school? 267 responses



Conclusions/Thoughts


- 91% of survey respondents WANT to bike to school!
- 70% of survey respondents are within a 30-minute bike ride to school or less
- The top 3 reasons given for not biking are safety, too far, and too much uphill/slopes
 - Bike Parking At Schools Should Be Improved Too
- Highway 22/1A Intersections Need Better Signage/Crossings!


